### THE INTERNATIONAL LIAISON COMMITTEE OF PRESIDENTS

The ILCP meeting last year was held from November 8-9, in Dublin, Republic of Ireland and was hosted by the Faculty of Pathology of the Royal College of Physicians of Ireland. For the past few years the President (or Vice-President) of our College has joined with the Presidents of the Royal College of Pathologists, Association of Clinical Pathologists, the Royal College of Pathologists of Australasia, The College of American Pathologists, The American Society of Clinical Pathologists, the World Association of Societies of Pathology, the Canadian Association of Pathologists, annually to discuss matters of mutual concern and interest to pathologists.

The attendees at the 1997 meeting were welcomed by the Dean of the Faculty of Pathology and the President of the Royal College at a reception in the library in the head-quarters building at #6 Kildare Street, Dublin. All formal sessions of the ILCP were conducted in the head-quarters.

The report of that meeting and discussions was presented to the Council by our Vice-President, Dr Collins, after it was finalised by the group. The meeting covered a wide range of topics including:

- (a) Changes in Provision of Pathology Services in the UK.
- (b) Changes in Postgraduate Training in Pathology in Great Britain and Ireland International Implications.
  (c) The College of American Pathologists SNOMED Project. (d) Informatics--Improving Computer Literacy & Use of Computer in Information Sharing and Education. (e) Credit for Continuing Medical Education Courses Presented by Foreign Societies. (f) Cytopathology-Collaboration of International Pathology Societies Relative to Standardized Terminology, Technology Evaluation, Continuing Education, Multinational Clinical Trials. (g) Pathology Society Input in Selection of Pathology Trainees. (h) Use of Non-Pathologist Assistants in Anatomic Pathology. (For those interested, the complete report of the detailed discussions are kept by the Registrar.)

A number of topics for discussion at this year's meeting in Hong Kong have already been submitted (see below). If you have any matters which you would like considered for discussion, please contact the President, Dr WP Mak.

- 6. Political and economic status of pathologists in the U.S.
- 7. Changes in practice characteristics of US pathologists.
- 8. Relation of Academy of Medicine, College of Pathologists and other organizations in pathology.
- 9. Changes in organization of laboratory based medicine and automation in pathology.
- 10. Continuing Medical Education.
- 11.Role of pathology organizations in dissemination of information to the public.

It is with regret that the College learned of the loss of Dr. Frederick ONG, O.B.E., Honorary Fellow of the College, who passed away peacefully on June 13th 1998.

Dr. ONG came from Singapore and he took up the study of medicine in the University of Hong Kong. After graduation, he decided on Forensic Pathology in the early '50s and had been instrumental in developing the Forensic Pathology Service of the then Medical & Health Department. He was the Consultant Forensic Pathologist-in-charge until his retirement in 1988. Dr. ONG was elected Honorary Fellow of The College for his dedication and contribution to the study of pathology in Hong Kong. He was well known for his sense of humour and he was never short of stories and jokes to share with friends and colleagues. He leaves his wife, a daughter and a son.
